vid Williams was dismissed from the team last week and didn't quit as was reported yesterday. Williams was on the No. 1 unit at the time.

"He was dismissed for lack of compliance with the prescribed level of participation with the rest of our football team," Schnellenberger said. "He just wouldn't do what the other guys were doing and he had been given all the warnings."

However, two players who have quit are defensive back Rick Shaw and linebacker Frank Pierre-Louis, both senior reserves who left the squad this week.

"Their cases were really disturbing to me," Schnellenberger said. "That's the first time in my career that I've worked with kids for two years and they've quit without them coming in and talking and telling me the reason. They didn't say boo to anybody."

Their departure leaves U of L with only eight players who were there when Schnellenberger arrived two years ago: Thieneman, offensive tackle Jim Nauert, tight end Jeff Pointer, Knighton, fullback Tim Maxwell, linebacker Ron Madrick, defensive back David Miller and punter Kirk Kennedy.
